Biography

Companion Himes, known by the nickname ‘Bud’, was born the 30th of December, 1935, in Portsmouth, Ohio. Educated in public schools there, he attended The Ohio State University for two years, pursuing a degree in Civil Engineering. He joined the US Army in 1953 and completed his education at various colleges and universities over the next several years, as duties and assignments would permit, eventually receiving his Bachelor Degree in Political Science from Georgetown University. He married Glenda J. Cobb in 1978, and they have two sons, and four grand-children. During his 28 year military career, he served in Special Forces, qualified as a Master Parachutist, Ranger, and Airborne Pathfinder. He retired from active duty in 1981 as a Chief Warrant Officer, while assigned to the Defense Intelligence Agency as a Soviet Weapons Systems Analyst.

Companion Himes was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Daleville Lodge No. 903 in March 1982. He is Past Master of Newton Lodge No. 224, Newton, Alabama, and is presently Secretary of Metcalf Lodge No. 599, Slocomb, Alabama. Bud was exalted to the Royal Arch Degree in Dothan Chapter No. 113, Dothan, Alabama, in 1983 and is a Past High Priest. He was greeted as a Royal and Select Master in Dothan Council No. 68 and is a Past Illustrious Master. Bud was knighted in Dothan Commandery No. 25 and is a past Commander.

Companion Himes has served on several Grand Lodge Committees, as Grand Sentinel of the Grand Chapter, and as the Chairman of the General Grand Chapter RARA Committee. He is Past President of the Alabama Council of Anointed High Priests and has received the General Grand Chapter Distinguished Award in Bronze. Companion Bud served the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama as Most Illustrious Grand Master in 1993-1994 and is Past Thrice Illustrious Master of the Order of the Silver Trowel. He is a Past Knight Crusader of the East of the Knights Crusader of the Cross. He is Past Prior of Alabama Priory, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, and holds one Grand Quadrant of the Knights of the York Grand Cross of Honour. He is Past Governor of Alabama College of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America and recipient of the Order of the Purple Cross.

He was appointed Regional Deputy General Grand Master for the Southeast Region from 1993-1996. He was elected General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work at the Triennial in Wichita Falls, KS, in 1999, elected Deputy General Grand Master in Atlantic City, NJ, in 2002, and elected and installed Most Puissant General Grand Master in Rapid City, SD, in 2005 for the 43rd Triennium of 2005-2008.

Other Masonic Affiliations, in Alabama, include Charter Member of Old Cahaba Council, Allied Masonic Degrees; member of Alcazar Shrine, AANOMS; Past Worthy Patron, Kolb Chapter, OES; member of the Masonic Society; member of Saint Asaph Conclave, RCC; member of Jerusalem Tabernacle XXXII, HRAKTP; Past Great Chief of Vulcan Council No. 22, Knight Masons; member of Rose Crucians; member of Bandar Grotto, MOVPR; National Sojourners Chapter No. 365; the Past Officers Association of Maine; and the Order of The Sword of Bunker Hill. Brother Himes is a 32^o Knight C Cross of Honor in the Valley of Dothan, Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Masonic Jurisdiction, a member of the Valley of Moline, Illinois, Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, and a member of the Royal Order of Scotland

Companion Bud is a member of the Military Officers Association of America, the Disabled American Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Vietnam Veterans Association, the Kentucky Colonels, and the Alabama Sheriffs Association.

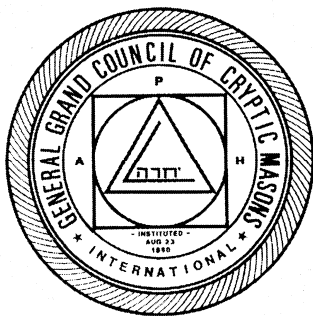

NECROLOGY REPORT
(REPORT OF THE GENERAL GRAND CHAPLAIN)
Jimmie L. Windham

To the Most Puissant General Grand Master, General Grand Council officers, distinguished guests, and companions.

Psalm 121 reads:

I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.

My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth.

He will not suffer thy foot to be moved: he that keepeth thee shall not slumber.

Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep.

The Lord is thy keeper: the Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand.

The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night.

The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve thy soul.

The Lord shall preserve thy going out, and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore.

This psalm fits well against the backdrop of a pilgrimage for it is concerned with the uncertainties one faces on such a journey. It moves naturally from the need for help to the promise of God's protection. The psalmist is not looking to the hills as a source of help but as a source of threat or harm. Then he raises the question "from whence cometh my help?" And then he gives the answer, from God.

Today we mourn the loss of 94 of our companions who have faced the pilgrimage from this life to the next. When we think about them, we see them as fathers, brothers, sons, husbands, friends, and companions, but God sees them as his children. They have faced all the threats of life, but now God has given them protection in His loving hands. His call to them to "come home" is a great loss to us, but a great gain for them. His unbounded love for each of them has removed them from this world of sin, pain, and sorrow and has taken them to a place of peace, joy, and eternal happiness. We will miss them the remaining days of our lives, but we rest assured of a joyful reunion in the world to come.

The Masonic graveside service tells us to "cast around their foibles, whatever they may have been, the broad mantle of Masonic charity, nor withhold from their memory the commendation that their virtues claim at our hands." We each have fond memories of our companions who have passed away in the last three years. We know their foibles and their virtues and it behooves us to show great charity, for one day we will be in need of others charity. We

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should remember them as we would want to be remembered when our names are listed in this necrology report. They have earned our love and respect. We should look back on them and remember the good that survives them.

Some of those who served this General Grand Council in different capacities were James H. Cockerham, a Past Deputy from Missouri, Roger L. Galusha, an Ambassador from Nebraska, Donald M. Keiser, General Grand Conductor of the Council from Oklahoma, and James E. Preston, an ambassador from Michigan.

One of our companions, that was called home, was Most Puissant Past General Grand Master Charles F. Van Etten and his eulogy will be given by Most Puissant Past Grand Master Orville Wesseler.

In Memoriam CHARLES F. VAN ETTEN

Charles F. Van Etten was born November 3, 1918 in Gowanda, NY and passed away Friday, August 17, 2007 in St. Joseph's, Buffalo, NY. Charles was self-employed in many fields which included farming, construction, grain handling and landscaping. He was predeceased by his first wife, Florence in April 1975 and also a daughter, Linda Van Etten and a brother, Clair. He is survived by his second wife, Betty, whom he married in 1983. Besides his wife of 24 years, he is survived by a son Allan, 8 grand children and nine great grand children

Besides his family and friends, Masonry was his great love. He started his search for Masonic Light in Phoenix Lodge #269, Gowanda, being a 64 year member serving as Master in 1951-1952 and was a life member.

In Capitular Masonry, he was exalted in Gowanda Chapter # 136 in May, 1944 and served as High Priest in 1950.

In Cryptic Masonry, he was greeted in Hamburg Council # 91 November, 1952. He was a Charter Member and served as Illustrious Master in 1963. He was elected and served as Most Illustrious Grand Master of New York in 1988-1989.

In the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International, he was appointed General Grand Marshal for the 1990-1993 Triennium. He was elected General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work in 1993 in Biloxi, MS and being regularly advanced through the line was elected and installed as Most Puissant General Grand Master in Wichita, KS on his 81st birthday, November 3, 1999

Charles was a member of the Scottish Rite Bodies, Valley of Jamestown, NY and was Coroneted with the 33rd Degree in September, 1999.

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Companion Charles had membership and worked in the following Appendant Bodies--He served as Grand Patron of the Order of the Eastern Star in 1974. Empire State Priory # ,46Knight of the York Cross of Honor, Niagara Frontier College # ,27York Rite Sovereign College, receiving the Order of the Purple Cross in 1990, St. Mark Conclave Red Cross of Constantine, Good Shepherd Tabernacle # XXX HRAKTP, and Grand Master's Council A Allied Masonic Degree.

To meet Charles with his smile and hand shake, a statement attributed to the late Will Rogers comes to mind. "I never met a man I didn't like".

Another of our companions that was called home was Most Puissant Past General Grand Master Evan L. Fleming and his eulogy will be given by Companion Van Aubrey Evans.

In Memoriam
EVAN L. FLEMING, JR.

Evan L. Fleming, Jr. was born in Elbert County, Georgia, on December 30, 1922, the son of Evan L. Fleming, Sr. and Erah E. Pitts. He attended the public schools and graduated in 1940. In January 1941, he entered the R. G. LeTourneau Machinist School at Toccoa, Georgia. At the beginning of World War II, he was transferred to Vicksburg, Mississippi, to build a plant to produce 155 millimeter shells for the Armed Forces and earth moving equipment. He was employed by the LeTourneau Company for over 50 years, receiving one of only two 50 year anniversary pins that the company had ever presented, the other one going to Mr. R. G. LeTourneau himself, the founder of the company.

Evan married the former Carrie E. Clark of Pattison, Mississippi. They had two children, a son, Evan L. Fleming, III, who is married with two children and living at Ft. Smith, Arkansas, and a daughter, Jeri W. Hulgan, who is married with two children and living at Yellville, Arkansas.

Evan was a member of the Methodist Protestant Church and served several terms on the board of Stewards and the Board of Religious Education. He also served several years as Sunday School Superintendent for his church.

Evan joined the Masonic Lodge on October 18, 1945, and the York Rite bodies in 1946. He served as presiding officer of all his local bodies. He then served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Mississippi, Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Mississippi, Grand Master of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Mississippi, and Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Mississippi.

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He was an active member of the Jackson Scottish Rite bodies and was honored with the designation of 33rd Degree. He was also a member of numerous appendant Masonic bodies and served as presiding officer over most of them. He served as Great Chief of Knight Masons of the United States.

He was elected General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International in 1984 and was elected Most Puissant General Grand Master of the General Grand Council in 1990.

Evan had a great love and dedication to Masonry and it is rare, indeed, to find anyone with more zeal and determination to further the cause of our craft. He made friends throughout the world. His smile, sparkling eyes and firm handshake made one feel welcome when meeting him and the stories he told are legendary. He, literally, could “walk with kings and not lose the common touch”.

Evan L. Fleming, Jr. died at his residence in Vicksburg, MS, on the morning of Tuesday, April 11, 2006. A Grand Lodge funeral was held at Wintergreen Cemetery in Port Gibson, MS.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL GRAND RECORDER

I am pleased to present my report as your General Grand Recorder.

The General Grand Council now holds affiliation with 52 Grand Councils.
During this Triennium we were happy to present Grand Charters to Brazil, and
were most happy to issue Letters of Dispensation to form Councils in Puerto
Rico and Togo in Africa.

We have had additional continuing inquiries from Mexico, Paraguay, and Gua-
temala..

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At the end of 2002, our membership stood at 115, 079. At the end of 2005, our membership was 92,255. At the end of 2007 our membership stood a little over 91,000. It would appear that the tremendous loss of membership is slowing. Vermont has reported a gain of members this year, and several other jurisdictions have lost only a handful of members. Whether we are greeting more new members, or whether the losses by death, demit, or suspension have diminished, it is still a positive note for the leadership of our fraternity to build upon.

Membership and financial resources continue to be the two most important issues facing our fraternity. Every member here has a different opinion on membership attraction and retention. The one fact that we can be sure of is that our current membership is older, and plans must be executed to attract the younger member. We all know what has to be done.

We need to generate income from sources other than per capita dues and investments. We do not have enough members or capital to make this work. We need to seek out and approve other means of generating income for the General Grand Council and to assist our member Grand Councils. Your finance committee and I have had discussion on these matters, and will be working hard this next year to see if a program can be presented to you for consideration. Our membership and finance committees and officers will work together with the other Masonic Bodies. We all face the same issues..

Electronic communication has helped our effort, but it is difficult at times to overcome the differences in foreign customs and language. We are truly an international organization, and spreading the word of Cryptic Masonry throughout the globe is important. We are pleased to present Charters to Puerto Rico and Togo, and look for good things from them as well. We welcome them into our Cryptic Family.

I was pleased to have prepared the awards and Credentials for presentation at the Annual Assemblies of each our Jurisdictions. I am happy to report that nearly half of the Adult Youth Leadership awards have been presented to exceptional ladies working with our youth.

I have traveled to many of our Jurisdictional Annual Assemblies and Regional Conferences during this Triennium. The reception and hospitality has been great, and is truly appreciated.

The highlight of my travel was a trip I took with our General Grand Master, Bud Himes. We traveled to Puerto Rico to institute a new Council. Royal Arch Masonry has been active there for over fifty years, and now they have a Council working under dispensation. The real highlight is when Bud asked me to install the officers of this new Council, and to present the Paul Revere

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Charges to them as new officers. Equally exciting was to attend a Masonic Wedding while we were there in which the Grand Master of Masons presided. Just when you think you have seen Masonry in its finest, a new window always appears in front of you.

The Cryptic Freemason magazine has not increased much at all in circulation. We continually look for ways to reduce the cost of the magazine, both in printing and in postage.

The magazine is currently under the watchful eye of George Sellars, our PCW, but he is certainly willing to turn this ongoing project to an interested Companion. Additionally, I appeal to all our Companions to bring him new and meaningful material.

My thanks go to Kenneth Chandler for his assistance in the financial matters of this Office. He was always there when I needed his counsel and advice. Previous to this Triennium, there were funds of money maintained separately by the Treasurer and the Recorder. Time to gather around the Triennial Assembly, even if you can't tell a Companion from a Grand Companion or better yet a Puissant Companion. We get a chance to rub elbows with those who gather to give direction to the General Grand Council and to report the achievements of the past thirty-six (36) months.

What a beginning to the Triennial! It's not every year that you get to undertake a new adventure that includes great people, interesting programs, new concepts and the ability to serve others. This as I see it, is a complete package. Thanks to you, it was possible to undertake this journey.

Here-in is a detailed report of the past three (3) years... First, this is a unique office to hold and to be a part of an exciting time for this organization. It is also the right time for change, "Real Change" for the Cryptic Rite. Initially it took a few months to get my feet wet. Perhaps you may have missed it. It takes time to settle in, receiving encouragement from your peers and feedback from the membership. The Most Puissant Companion Maurice C. 'Bud' Himes and Right Puissant Companion Joseph J. Vale have been supportive and encouraging the development of the defining programs for the Cryptic Rite. The assignments were extreme, even a little preposterous at times, but it made sense as an administrator to bring to you a unique view of the position of the Cryptic Rite as we analyze it. To comprehend where we must be in five (5) to twenty-five (25) years, an analysis of our history and financial obligations were initiated. We then examined the present situation and how it fits the new larger picture. Finally, we set out to give a new direction and vitality to a complacent Cryptic market. In order to create order to a confusing objective, an outline called, "A

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"Proud Past, A Promising Future" was prepared as a handbook For the General Grand Council. This was the Vision Program to create the documents and programs for the decade. This was the formative mechanism to develop "what" we will be in the future, What does the 'Proud Past, A Promising Future' have to offer? Strategic Planning, Business Planning, Summary of G.G.C. officers responsibilities, Membership Programs, Resources and Calendar of Events or Timelines are the basic launching paths to a new horizon for the General Grand Council.

As we had observed it we needed to change, "Real Change" for a different future, that is, the right changes in our attitude and in our obsolete operating procedures and laws. This would give impetuous to reasonable actions on behalf of the membership and provide a more exciting and rewarding Cryptic Rite. What was the inertia or philosophy driving the planning stages?

The "Vision" to turn Brothers into York Rite Masons.

The "Resources" to make Masonic lives even better.

The "Courage" to lead the way.

The "Greatest Risk" is not taking one.

To make a "Difference", even in the face of great challenges.

For us "Success" is the only true measure of a Masonic adventure.

The results of the administrative analysis brought the first document called, "Delivering the Promise", a Strategic Plan of the General Grand Council, International. A five (5)page document to improve our performance, stimulate positive thinking, solving organizational problems and to influence, rather than to be influence. Developing a plan is a good way of doing business, creating the strategies for the next five (5) to Twenty-five (25) years and it helps the membership stay in focus to the business plan. Copies can be obtained through the General Grand Council's office or elected officers. Step one completed!!!

The planning stages, coupled with the first document resulted in the second step in the process. We then developed a "Mission" and "Vision" message for the organization. It has been written and made part of the proposed New Constitution. With the second step competed, we then prepared corporate and financial objectives. This was to stimulate our game plan and give substance to the strategic plan. The next step in the process of the organizational planning was to bring the business plan into practice and to review the laws pertaining to the objectives. A careful review of the "Present Constitution" resulted in determining that there was: a lack of major operating substance, job responsibilities, financial guidance, and together with the previous approved legislation, made it difficult to amend the present Constitution, Therefore, it was re-written and reorganized. What does this proposed "New Constitution" provide?

1. Corporation structure.
2. Operating procedures for the Corporation.

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3. Corp. Board of Directors.
4. Mission and Vision Statements.
5. Aims & Purposes of the General Grand Council.
6. Job responsibility of *G.G.* officers
7. Life Membership section.
8. Endowment Fund for the Corporation.
9. Fee changes.
10. Per Capita changes.
11. Realignment of sections in the Present Constitution to the new

document,

We then developed a financial guide with seventy (70) recommendations or strategies to enhance our financial base. Some of which have been incorporated into the New Constitution or is slated for further development for the next triennial. The New Constitution has been in development stages for the past three (3) Years and had nine (9) major revisions the twelve (12) page document. It has been submitted on time for your review and adoption at this Triennial.

Between the administrative reorganizations, our travels took us all over the United States, including Canada, Europe & Africa. We can't think the people we met enough for their gracious hospitality. It has been a humbling experience in your jurisdictions: Alabama (twice), Arkansas (twice), California, District of Columbia Florida (twice), Germany (twice), Indiana (twice), Kansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan (thrice), Minnesota (twice), Mississippi, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Dakota, New York (twice), North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Washington, Wisconsin (twice), plus Ontario, Canada (twice), Ohio and Togo, Africa. All of those above and the Regional meetings as well, including the York Rite Sovereign College Annual Assemblies (thrice) and the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar Triennial Conclave in Texas. One hundred eighty one (181) separate activities, venturing over three hundred seventy three (373) days. Details are on file with the General Grand Recorder.

Countless miles, meeting great people and having fun in the process. It couldn't get better!!! All of this and helping to re-design the future for the Cryptic Rite for the membership. It's different. But so is Freemasonry today. Tomorrow will bring changes different than today.

Would you like to join the "Team"? Let George Know. He's looking for a few good men!!! This has to be exciting. It's a moment of exhilaration in Masonic time. It's a new day for the Cryptic Rite. Be a part of it. Tell your membership, "It's Council Time".

REPORT OF THE GENERAL GRAND MASTER **MAURICE C. "BUD" HIMES**

My Companions, what an incredible journey the past twelve years have been. Let me thank you for that opportunity. Over that time, I have had the chance to travel to so many different places, and make friends I would not otherwise have had an opportunity to meet.

My wife and I have remarked many times that neither of us ever expected to find ourselves in some of the exotic places, enjoying very different cultures and customs, and seeing things we had only read about in books or seen in movies or television.

I wish to break with usual custom here and express my heart-felt thanks to my wife Glenda. I know this is usually done at the end, but her support and advice deserves more than an afterthought of recognition. Through all this, she has been my navigator, advisor and proofreader. She is the one who encourages and remotivates me when I am frustrated and discouraged, and my cheerleader and giver of praise when I do something right. We have been through so many difficult times, such as the flu in Greece, Heathrow Airport, bad weather and bad food. Through it all she has kept her balance and therefore mine. I absolutely would have not been able to accomplish anything without her support, even when she thought I was wrong. All of the gifts in the world would not be enough, so all I can offer her is my love and hope it will suffice.

I realize that I have made some of you angry, and many of you have disagreed with me over something I have done or said. I can only apologize, try to assure you I took your point of view seriously, and then felt I had to do whatever was best for the General Ground Council even at the risk of the loss of your friendship or good esteem. Perhaps now that this time in office is over, we can reconcile our differences and see who can best work and best agree.

At the same time, I have been constantly encouraged by the many of you who offered me encouragement and good advice when I needed it, which was almost constantly. There are so many decisions to be made in this office of General Grand Master, and none of us possesses the wisdom to know all the answers to them.

My thanks to the many of you who took on some thankless task whenever I asked it of you and gave selflessly of your time and efforts on our behalf. I wish I had time to thank you individually.

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I certainly didn't accomplish all that I wanted. But I also accomplished more than I thought I would. I probably spent more time, worry, and sleepless nights over the magazine than any single item during this past three years. In the end, we just could not afford the vision he had for it.

The last two issues have been put together by the Officers of the General Grand Council, compiled and made ready for print at the direction of the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, George Sellars, and printed and mailed by the General Grand Recorder and his family members.

This may work for one or even two issues, but it cannot continue. We seriously need an editor who can handle these tasks and relieve those officers of the additional responsibilities. I sincerely thank them for taking on the added work, and it is certainly one of the thankless tasks I mentioned earlier.

I am intensely proud of the distance the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation has come. . Each year, other, the contributions increase at a tremendous rate, and have not stopped. We now are at the point in our relationship with the School and Research Center that was almost beyond my wildest dreams.

I'm not taking the credit for that. It's entirely your contributions and interest that have made this happen. All I have done is gather information and try to get it to you in a language you can understand.

I did not make one of them unless it was to further Cryptic Masonry and the General Grand Council. Many of those jurisdictions had for many years felt neglected and unrecognized. That has changed, and they now feel they are fully a partner and contributor to Cryptic Masonry throughout the world. I have been able to convince them that the General Grand Council was as interested in them as they were in us, which is as it should be.

You must understand that the attraction of the American System of York Rite, as it is known throughout the world, is that eventually, if the Companions so desire and are willing to put forth the effort, they become independent and self-governing.

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This concept is something new and exciting to them because many of them have not had any form of self determination in any aspect of their lives for more than seventy years. FIRST REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Puissant General Grand Master, Officers, and Members of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International:

This is the first part of the Report of the Jurisprudence Committee.

1. The Life Membership issue and decision by the M.P.G.G.M exceeded his authority. MIC Burselson moved the adoption of this portion of the report. The motion was regularly seconded and approved and ordered adopted!

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2. The New Constitution was sent out in a timely manner and was in proper form with exception of the omission of the Life Membership provisions which was adopted and approved at the last Triennial. MIC Burleson moved the adoption of this portion. Two MIC from Michigan objected and discussion ensued during which time MIC Burleson explained why the section was improper. He further explained if the provision was submitted it would be improper because it was not included in the proper section of the Old Constitution. He then explained where it properly belonged in the New Constitution which he then moved the inclusion of this provision in its proper location. The motion was seconded and discussed. Discussion occurred as to whether or not the motion would be unconstitutional because the Resolution was not proposed and submitted to the Grand Council and Constituent Councils as required in the Constitution within the proper timeframes. The motion was withdrawn! A Motion to consider the Jurisprudence Committee's report be now accepted was regularly seconded and upon the vote failed. The constitution will be considered line by line.
3. The balance of the Resolutions, were received in a timely manner and are in proper format to be addressed at the Triennial. MIC Burleson moved adoption of this portion of the report. It was regularly seconded and approved.

MIC Burleson moved the acceptance of this report on behalf of the committee. It was seconded and accepted.

This is the report of the Credentials Committee:

Marion shared with the Directors that the Lawyer handling the C. Herbert Grauling Estate in Baltimore County, Maryland had sent us a Fourth (Not Final) Administration Account. The Account stated that the total amount in estate to be retained for fifth accounting is \$1,903,513.32. There was nothing else to report at this time. The estate is still attempting to sell the real property. Some think that we should hire an attorney to demand/get a copy of the filing with the probate court which describes the exact worth/value and distribution of the estate. If we do not receive an accurate accounting and partial distribution before October. This report is required to be filed annually with the court and we should be getting a copy of that report. I was advised to wait until Oct 1, 2008 for distribution to appear before taking any action, should a partial distribution not be made at that time.

The budget as passed at the February Board meeting is to be carried over to the February 2009 meeting in Washington DC.

We will continue the pledge of giving \$200,000.00 per year to the I.U. School of Medicine or every dollar that is donated by individuals; whichever is more until the Board of Directors decide something different. If we received requests for matching funds that exceed the two hundred thousand, we will honor those requests, providing they are \$10,000.00 or more.

Joe Vale is working on a sculpture as a fund raiser for this triennium. The proceeds of those sales will be divided three (3) ways between CMMRF, George Washington Masonic Memorial and the GG Council Endowment Corporation. The distribution details are to be worked out later.

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SECOND REPORT OF THE **JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE** **ROBERT E. BURLESON**

To the Most Puissant General Grand Master, Officers, and Members of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International:

This is the second Report of the Jurisprudence Committee on the Resolutions for consideration at this Triennial Assembly.

1. The first resolution of the new Constitution was found not to be in proper form due to several omissions, particularly the Life Membership section. Therefore, according to the present Constitution it necessitates the new Constitution to layover until corrections are completed and the membership is properly informed. RPC George C. Sellars, General Grand P.C. W., author of the Resolution, moved to Withdraw the Resolution from consideration at this Triennial. The motion was seconded, much discussion followed and the motion to Withdraw was approved.
2. The second Resolution on Life Membership was withdrawn, because of omissions and was not in proper form with the present Constitution. R.P.C. Kenneth D. Chandler, General Grand Treasurer, moved for the Withdrawal. The Withdrawal motion was seconded and was approved.
3. The third Resolution was found to be in proper form for consideration by the membership on Per Capita increases from \$.35 to \$1.00 and \$1.50 for overseas Jurisdictions. Following considerable debate an amendment was offered by MIC Anthony Chamberlain, MIGM of MI, to increase the amount to \$2.00 to the membership and \$2.50 for overseas Jurisdictions. The amendment was seconded, discussed and then defeated. Upon calling the question on the original Resolution as amended and corrected was called for from the floor and was approved to increase the Per Capita to \$1.00 and \$1.50 for overseas Jurisdictions.
4. An August 2005 Resolution on Life Membership was read and an amendment offered as follows:
 - a) The General Grand Council Recorder shall authorize to make available a Life Membership Certificate to all Cryptic Masons or Royal and Select Masters upon proper application and certification of the Grand Recorder of the Jurisdiction of which the Companion is a member. Such Certificate shall contain the Signature of the Most Puissant General Grand Master and the Right Puissant General Grand Recorder.

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- b) All Membership records necessary to authenticate such membership shall be maintained by the individual Grand Recorder in each respective Constituent Jurisdiction.
- c) The individual Grand Council shall establish the amount necessary to purchase such membership in their jurisdiction.
- d) Any individual Cryptic Mason or Royal and Select Master in good standing, may purchase a prepaid life membership by paying to the Grand Recorder in his jurisdiction, the amount equal to that established for a prepaid life membership in his jurisdiction.
- e) All funds paid by an individual member shall be maintained by the Grand Council of the jurisdiction in which the Companion is a member. The annual dues or per capita collected or assessed shall be the amount as identified in Article X Section 3 of the Constitution. Submitted by: M.P.C. Maurice C. "Bud" Himes; R.P.C. Joe Vale; R.P.C. George C. Sellars; R.P.C. Kenneth D. Chandler; and R.P.C. Ronald E. Fullerlove.

It was amended to correct the Constitution as follows: Article X Section 3 to Article I Section 17. Upon balloting the amendment passed. A second amendment was offered to add to section e) and no distribution shall be made from the grand Council until twelve months have elapsed. The motion to amend was Withdrawn. (M.P.C. Himes reminded the delegates they need to return to their respective jurisdictions and state the proposed New Constitution was defeated but a revised version would be forthcoming!)

M.I.C. Burluson moved that the Reports of Jurisprudence Committee, in total, are accepted. The motion was seconded and approved.

REPORT OF THE **FINANCE COMMITTEE** **JAMES C. MC GEE**

To the Most Puissant General Grand Master, Officers and members of the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International:

The Finance Committee has reviewed the financial records of the General Grand Council and found them to be in order. The other members of the Committee are Stanley Morrill of Minnesota and J.B. Hitt of Kentucky.

The Committee thanks the General Grand Recorder Ronald Fullerlove and General Grand Master Bud Himes for being frugal with our funds this triennial.

Recommendations:

1. The budget I have outlined is based on the increase in the per capita tax. This year's budget has some items increased that provide a benefit to the Grand Councils in the area of education and membership and some areas have been cut namely the triennial expenses. As mentioned in previous Finance committee reports the decrease in revenues and the increase in the budget deficits have not been caused by over spending or a lack of proper budgeting but by a decrease in membership. The incoming officers have shown the leadership necessary to begin the process of restoring financial

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security to the General Grand Council by approving these budget adjustments.

2. The authorized Officers should reinvest the General Grand Council funds to receive maximum returns on the invested funds.

3. Because of the large loss in members over the past years in the General Grand Council, the leadership is interested in developing income producing programs that will not only provide the funds necessary to restore the budget items we have eliminated this term, but also to provide for a continuation of a balanced budget, to provide the funds necessary to provide services to the Constituent Grand Councils, and ultimately to provide the funds necessary to endow the General Grand Council for the future.

4. No specific plan is being recommended at this time, however your elected General Grand Council Officers need to be empowered to research and implement appropriate revenue enhancement programs. In every case, the General Grand Councils and the Constituent Grand Councils will not be at risk for such programs, but the individual members who wish to participate will ultimately generate income for the Cryptic Rite.

2. An Operating Fund for the General Grand Council related to revenue enhancement programs. This establishes a Foundation which does not now exist and establishes operating procedures thereof. R.P.C. Sellars moved for acceptance of the Report. There being no objection or discussion it was so ordered.

M.P.C. Dalvin Hollaway, P.G.G.M., stated an amendment was submitted at the 42nd Triennial, which set a limit on Per Capita Tax to no more than 10,000 members. The issue was submitted on time, and then laid over to be considered

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at this Triennial. Several responses were received from the membership. Upon the question being put to the membership the motion not receiving a 2/3's majority was defeated.

A discussion on the Proceedings and the manner presented was clarified by the General Grand Recorder. A corrected version of the Proceedings will be sent to the delegates.

A motion to elect R.P.C. Ronald E. Fullerlove, General Grand Recorder Emeritus was seconded and approved. R.P.C. Fullerlove, then, received a hearty applause for his service.

MISCELLANEOUS COMMENTS

M.P.C. Himes then thanked the Host Committee of Indiana for all their tireless work on behalf of the membership. This was put into the form of a motion and was passed.

Two Companions gave comments: Orville E. Wesseler, PGGM and IC Phillip E. Fowler, PGHP of Indiana, General Chairman. Both received a hearty round of applause.

No Further business being apparent, the 2005-2008 Triennial was declared at refreshment at 2:55 P.M. for the Installation of Officers at 3:30 P.M.

GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL AWARDS

General Grand Council Medal of Honor:

One medal awarded each Triennium to an outstanding Cryptic Mason for service to Masonry and who is well known in the Arts, Science, Business, Religion or Government. Nominations shall be made to the General Grand Masters and selection approved by the elective officers.

Mordhurst Medal:

A medal awarded to the Grand Recorder of a Grand Council who has served 15 years or more, and not to be awarded prior to the date of qualification.

Columbian Medal:

A medal awarded to an outstanding Cryptic Mason for service to Masonry. One medal for each Region, and not more than three medals at-large per Triennium. Nominations made to the Regional Deputies by 31 December of the year prior to the Triennial Assembly and selection by the elective officers.

Cryptic Masons of the Year Medal and Lapel Pin:

One medal each year presented to a Cryptic Mason by the General Grand Council to a man selected by each Grand Council for outstanding service to Cryptic Masonry. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council will select its own Cryptic Mason of the Year according to the following rules and regulations:

A. Only one medal may be awarded annually to a Cryptic Mason in each affiliated Grand Council.

B. Only one medal may be awarded triennially to a Cryptic Mason in each Subordinate council of the General Grand Council.

C. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council shall determine its own method of selecting the Cryptic Mason of the Year in its jurisdiction.

D. No posthumous awards shall be made.

E. The award shall be made only for exceptional and meritorious service to Cryptic Masonry above and beyond the call of duty. No Past or Present Grand Master, or any advancing line officer of a Grand Council shall be eligible for this award, however, this restriction shall apply only to the Cryptic Mason of the Year Award, and not to the Adult Leadership Award.

F. The General Grand Recorder shall be given the name of the selected Cryptic Mason to be engraved upon the medal at least thirty days prior to the date it is to be awarded. Subordinate Councils shall give the name of the selected Cryptic Mason to be engraved upon the medal at least six months prior to the next Triennial Assembly.

G. The General Grand Recorder shall cause the name of the honoree to be engraved upon the medal and forwarded to the Grand Recorder or Recorder, if to a subordinate Council, at the earliest time following receipt of the name.

Adult Leadership Award and Lapel Pin:

One medal presented annually in each Jurisdiction affiliated with General Grand Council to a nominee who shall be a leader in one of the youth organizations recognized by the General Grand Council, namely: Order of DeMolay, Order of Rainbow for Girls or Order of Job's Daughters.

A. Only one medal may be awarded annually in each Grand Council.

B. Only one medal may be awarded triennially in each Subordinate council of the General Grand Council.

C. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council shall determine its own method of selecting the Nominee in its jurisdiction.

D. No posthumous awards shall be made.

E. The award shall be made only for exceptional and meritorious service above and beyond the call of duty.

F. The General Grand Recorder shall be given the name of the selected Nominee to be engraved upon the medal at least thirty days prior to the date it is to be awarded. Subordinate Councils shall give the name of the selected Nominee to be engraved upon the medal at least six months prior to the next Triennial Assembly.

G. The General Grand Recorder shall cause the name of the honoree to be engraved upon the medal and forwarded to the Grand Recorder or Recorder, if to a subordinate Council, at the earliest time following receipt of the name.

Grand Master's Lapel Pin:

Each retiring Grand Master shall be presented a Lapel Pin, and Life Membership Card which designates him as a permanent member of the General Grand Council.

10% Gain Certificate:

For a Council gaining 10% or more in membership in one year. A request should be sent to the General Grand Recorder, and will be mailed to each state before their Annual Assembly. A General Grand Officer may be asked to make the presentation.

ARTICLE I
GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL STRUCTURE

SECTION 1. NAME. This body shall be known as the General Grand Council, Cryptic Masons International.

SECTION 2. MEMBERS. The members of the General Grand Council are:

- (a) All properly affiliated Past Grand Master of Constituent Grand Council.
- (b) All Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters, Grand Principal Conductors of the Work of Constituent Grand Councils or their Proxies. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)
- (c) The first three officers of each subordinate council under the jurisdiction of this General Grand Council, or their proxies. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Subordinate Council.)
- (d) Special Representatives of the General Grand Master.

SECTION 3. CONDUCT OF ASSEMBLIES. Assemblies are conducted as follows:

- (a) **MAJORITY VOTE.** At Triennial Assemblies all questions are to be determined by a majority vote unless otherwise provided. The presiding officer shall have no vote, except in case of a tie.
- (b) **MEMBER VOTE.** Each member shall be entitled to one vote as such; and one vote for each proxy held except as specified below. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)
- (c) **SUBORDINATE COUNCIL VOTE.** Representatives from a Subordinate Council shall jointly be entitled to one vote, the majority of such representatives present determining how the vote shall be cast.
- (d) **GENERAL GRAND OFFICERS VOTE.** All General Grand Council Officers, as specified in Article 1, Section 4 shall be entitled to one vote as such; and one vote for each proxy held. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)

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- (d) **GRAND MASTERS VOTE.** Those Grand Masters who serve more than one year as Grand Masters are entitled to one vote for each full year served.

SECTION 4. OFFICERS. The officers of this General Grand Council shall be:

Most Puissant General Grand Master
Right Puissant Deputy General Grand Master
Right Puissant General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work.
Right Puissant General Grand Treasurer
Right Puissant General Grand Recorder
Right Puissant Regional Deputy General Grand Masters
Right Puissant General Grand Chaplain
Right Puissant General Grand Captain of the Guard
Right Puissant General Grand Conductor of the Council
Right Puissant General Grand Marshal
Right Puissant General Grand Steward
Right Puissant General Grand Sentinel
who shall be a Past Grand Master of a Constituent Grand Council except for General Grand Treasurer, General Grand Recorder, General Grand Chaplain and any Foreign (outside the U.S.A.) Regional Deputy General Grand Master.

- (a) **ELECTIVE OFFICERS:** The General Grand Master, Deputy General Grand Master, General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, General Grand Treasurer and the General Grand Recorder shall be elected by ballot at each Triennial Assembly.
- (b) **APPOINTIVE OFFICERS:** The Regional Deputy Grand Masters, General Grand Chaplain, General Grand Captain of the Guard, General Grand Conductor of the Council, General Grand Marshal, General Grand Steward and the General Grand Sentinel shall be appointed by the General Grand Master to serve for a term of three (3) years and no Companion serving in any of these offices, except the General Grand Chaplain and any Foreign (outside the U.S.A.) Regional Deputy General Grand Master shall be eligible to succeed himself or to be appointed to another office during the Triennium succeeding the expiration of his term in office. However any appointive officer may be elected to a higher office in this General Grand Council at anytime.
- (c) **INSTALLATION.** The elected and appointed officers of this General Grand Council shall be installed at each Triennial Assembly, or as soon thereafter as is practicable.

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- (d) **VACANCY IN OFFICE.** Provided, however, should the office of General Grand Master be vacated by death, permanent disability, or other causes, the Deputy General Grand Master and the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work shall in the order named, be installed and succeed to the office, its title and prerogatives.
- (e) **DISABILITY.** Provided further, that the question of permanent disability or other causes as herein used shall be determined by the Committee on Cryptic Jurisprudence.
- (f) **PRECEDENCE OF RANK.** Precedence of Rank shall be:
 - Most Puissant General Grand Master
 - Right Puissant Deputy General Grand Master
 - Right Puissant General Grand Conductor of the Work
 - Right Puissant General Grand Treasurer
 - Right Puissant General Grand Recorder
 - Right Puissant Regional Deputy General Grand Masters all of equal status
 - Right Puissant General Grand Chaplain
 - Right Puissant General Grand Captain of the Guard
 - Right Puissant General Grand Conductor of the Council
 - Right Puissant General Grand Marshal
 - Right Puissant General Grand Steward
 - Right Puissant General Grand Sentinel

SECTION 5. STATED ASSEMBLIES. The Stated Assemblies of this General Grand Council shall be held Triennially, at such date and place as it shall determined; provided that if in the opinion of the General Grant] Master, or in case of his inability, then the senior General Grand Officer, there shall be danger to life or health from sickness or other local cause, by any meeting being held at the time or place appointed, he may change such meeting to some other time and place; and in the event of such change being made he shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder thereof, who shall forthwith notify the other officers and members in such manner as he may deem best calculated to effect the desired object.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ASSEMBLIES. The General Grand Master and the Deputy General Grand Master shall have authority to call a Special Assembly of the General Grand Council whenever they consider it expedient or necessary, and it shall be their duty to do so when properly requested by a majority of the Grand Councils, of which three (3) months notice shall be given of the time and place of the special meetings. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no business other than that for which it is called shall be transacted.

SECTION 7. QUORUM. A quorum of this General Grand Council shall consist of seven (7) Grand Councils.

SECTION 8. JURISDICTION. The General Grand Council shall watch over and protect the interests of Cryptic Masonry in the States, Districts or Territories which recognize its jurisdiction and where there is no Grand Council regularly established; and shall settle all difficulties which may arise and be referred to it, and shall give such advice and instructions as may seem most conducive to the peace, advancement and perpetuation of Cryptic Mason in its original integrity.

SECTION 9. POWERS AND DUTIES OF GENERAL GRAND MASTER.

- (a) **COUNCILS U.D.** The General Grand Master, or, in case of his inability to act, the Deputy General Grand Master, shall have the power to grant dispensations for new Subordinate Councils of Cryptic Masons in any State, District, or Territory where there is no Grand Council regularly established and working independently of any other Masonic Body; such dispensation in no case to extend beyond the time of the next Stated Assembly of this General Grand Council, but no new Subordinate Council shall be established by any State, District or Territory where there is a regular subordinate Council within a reasonable distance, without the consent of the Subordinate Council nearest the place where such new Subordinate Council is proposed to be located; and he shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder of such dispensation, and make report of the same at the next Triennial Assembly of this General Grand Council; when the General Grand Council may grant said Subordinate Council a Charter.
- (a) **REGIONAL DEPUTY GENERAL GRAND MASTERS.** The General Grand Master, or in his inability to act, the Deputy General Grand Master, shall have the power and authority to appoint in each of the Regions into which the Constituent Grand Councils are divided, a Regional Deputy General Grand Master who shall be a Past Grand Master, to represent him and have such duties and exercise such special powers and authority as may be granted to him by the General Grand Master or the Deputy General Grand Master.
- (a) **SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVES.** The General Grand Master shall have the power and authority to appoint in each District, Territory, State or Country where no Grand Council exists but where councils subordinate to this General Grand Council have been Chartered or may hereafter be established or chartered a Special Representative who shall represent him and have such duties and exercise such special powers and authority as may be granted to him by the General Grand Master or the Deputy General Grand Master and such Special Representatives shall serve at the pleasure of the General Grand Master and not longer than three (3) years

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unless re-appointed by the succeeding General Grand Master or Deputy General Grand Master. Such Special Representatives, if present at any Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council, shall be members of the same and entitled to one vote.

SECTION 10. FEES AND DUES OF SUBORDINATE COUNCILS.

- (a) **DISPENSATION AND PER CAPITA.** The fees for granting a dispensation shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and every Council holden by Dispensation, or Charter, from this body shall pay into the Treasury of the General Grand Council, the sum of one (1) dollar for each companion greeted therein, and fifty cents (\$0.50) annually for each member, until such time as a Grand Council shall be regularly established in that State, District or Territory in which such Council is located.
- (b) **FEES FOR CHARTER AND DEGREES.** The General Grand Recorder shall be paid by the petitioners five (5) dollars for his services in granting a charter. The fees in the several Councils under the immediate jurisdiction of this General Grand Council, for the Degrees of Royal Master and Select Master and the appendant degree of Super Excellent Master shall not be less than ten (10) dollars.

SECTION 11. GRAND COUNCIL FORMATION. Whenever there shall be three councils regularly constituted in any State, District or Territory, a Grand Council may be established as soon as convenience and propriety may dictate, provided the consent of the General Grand Master or the General Grand Council be first obtained.

SECTION 12. ANNUAL DUES. (Updated August 30, 2008)

- (a) The annual dues, or per capita, assessed each Constituent or Member Grand Council of the General Grand Council shall be the sum of \$1.00 (One Dollar) US for each Cryptic Mason or Royal and Select Master, in good standing, on their rolls as of the date of their Annual Grand Assembly, except those Life Members under the provisions of Section 17 of this Constitution.
- (b) The annual dues, or per capita, assessed each Constituent or Member Jurisdiction outside the Continental United States and Canada, with the exception of Alaska, Hawaii and the Provinces of Canada, shall be \$1.50 (One Dollar and Fifty Cents) US for each Cryptic Mason or Royal and Select Master, in good standing, on their rolls as of the date of their Annual Grand Assembly, except those Life Members under the provisions of Section 17 of this Constitution.

SECTION 13. ANNUAL RETURNS. The Grand Recorder of each Grand Council shall be required to transmit to the General Grand Recorder an official notice of the election of its Grand Officers within thirty (30) days thereafter,

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and also transmit to the General Grand Recorder two copies of their proceedings as soon as the same are printed.

SECTION 14. CHARTER OR DISPENSATION REQUIRED. Every Council of Cryptic Masons (or Council of Royal and Select Masters) must have a charter or dispensation from the General Grand Council, or from some Grand Council and no Council shall be deemed legal without such dispensation or charter; and Masonic communication, both public and private, is hereby interdicted and Forbidden between any Council or any member of it, and any Council or Assembly that may be so illegally formed or holden or opened without such Charter, or any person assumed to be received or greeted therein. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to apply to the jurisdiction of Virginia or West Virginia.

SECTION 15. SOVEREIGNTY OF GRAND COUNCILS. Each Grand Council shall determine the legal status of the Cryptic Masons (or Royal and Select Masters) of their several jurisdictions, and shall have absolute authority over and control of, the Cryptic Rite within their several Grand Jurisdictions; including the form and substance of the rituals used in conferring, in their respective jurisdictions, the Cryptic Rite of Masonry, to wit; Royal Master, Select Master, together with the degree of Super Excellent Master.

SECTION 16. MILEAGE AND PER DIEM. All elective and appointive General Grand Council Officers and Past General Grand Master, together with the chairmen of all standing committees, shall receive twenty (20) cents per mile one way traveling by the shortest route and forty (40) dollars per day for each day consumed in traveling to and from and tow days while in attendance at the Triennial Assemblies of this General Grand Council. Provided: That their expenses are not paid by any other Masonic General Grand Body for the same Period.

SECTION 17. LIFE MEMBERSHIP. (October 3, 2005)

- (a) Any Royal and Select Master, in good standing of a constituent Grand Council, may purchase a Life Membership in the General Grand Council by paying a sum of \$10.00 (Ten Dollars) to the Grand Recorder of his Grand Council, who will then pay that amount to the General Grand Recorder.
- (b) The Life Membership fees will be invested in a perpetual fund with the prevailing rate of interest being for general revenue for the General Grand Council but never to exceed 5% (five percent). Any interest earned in excess of the 5% will be returned to the corpus account. At 5%, this will give the General Grand Council \$.50 (Fifty Cents) per Life Member and relieve the constituent Grand Council from the \$.35 per year for each of its Life Members.

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- (c) The Royal and Select Masters with Life Membership will be kept separate from the Royal and Select Masters without Life Membership.
- (d) Cryptic Masons from jurisdictions, not subordinate to the General Grand Council, may purchase Life Membership at large for \$10.00 (Ten Dollars). This membership carries no special preferences nor a vote at the General Grand Assembly.
- (e) Each new life member will receive a special membership certificate designating his status with the General Grand Council.
- (f) Each constituent Grand Council may or may not adopt this Life Membership proposal.
- (g) If a Life Member transfers to another Grand Council Jurisdiction, he may take his Life Membership with him and the Grand Recorder of Jurisdiction to which he has transferred will inform the General Grand Recorder of the transfer and not pay the \$0.35 per year for this Life Membership.
- (h) If a Life Member is a Plural Member in his Jurisdiction, or Dual Member in another Grand Council Jurisdiction, his Life Membership is only good in each Council where he was a member when it was purchased. He may or may not purchase Life Memberships in all Councils where he is a member. However, the Grand Councils, to which he belongs, will pay the \$0.35 to the General Grand Recorder for each council where he doesn't hold a Life Membership.
- (i) Holders of Life Membership certificates are subject to all the laws, rules and regulations as provided in the code of any Grand Council Cryptic Masons or Royal and Select Masters and loss of membership by suspension or expulsion shall automatically abrogate his life membership and any claim to any portion of any such fees paid for such life membership.
- (j) Any Council or individual may purchase a Memorial Life membership in the name of a deceased Companion for the sum of \$10.00 provided that the Companion, in whose name the certificate is to be issued, was in good standing in a legally constituted Council at the time of his demise. A special membership certificate designating the Memorial Life membership for the deceased and the purchaser may be sent to the purchaser or the family of the deceased at the request of the purchaser.

ARTICLE II **SUBORDINATE COUNCILS**

SECTION 1. OFFICERS. A Council of Cryptic Masons under immediate jurisdiction of this General Grand Council shall consist of the following offic-

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ers; Illustrious Master, Deputy Master, Principal Conductor of the Work, Treasurer, Recorder, Captain of the Guard, Conductor of the Council, Marshal, Steward, Chaplain, Sentinel and as many other members as may be convenient for working together.

SECTION 2. ANNUAL RETURNS. Every Council under the immediate Jurisdiction of this General Grand Council shall annually make a return to the General Grand Recorder of their name, number, location and time of stated meetings with a list of officers and members, degrees conferred, companions admitted, died, suspended or expelled in accordance with the form furnished from the office of the General Grand Recorder.

SECTION 3. UNDER DISPENSATION. Every Council under dispensation from this General Grand council shall at the close of its period, return to the General Grand Recorder its dispensation and records.

SECTION 4. DEGREES. The degrees recognized by this General Grand Council are as follows and must be conferred only in the order named: ROYAL MASTER, SELECT MASTER, AND SUPER EXCELLENT MASTER.

ARTICLE III STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS. The General Grand Master (elect), after installation, and before the close of the session, shall appoint the following committees, whose term shall extend and be analogous with the term of the General Grand master, unless by him sooner removed by the appointment of his or their successors, viz:

- (a) **FINANCE AND ACOOUNTS.** A committee of FINANCE AND AC-COUNTS, consisting of as many members as in the judgment of the General Grand Master shall be necessary, whose duty it shall be to examine and pass upon all business of a financial nature; to examine the books and accounts of the General Grand Treasurer and the General Grand Recorder, and make a report thereof in writing, as early as may be, during the session of the General Grand Council and to perform such other duties as the General Grand Council may refer to them.
- (b) **CRYPTIC JURISPRUDENCE.** A committee on CRYPTIC JURISPRUDENCE, consisting of as many members as in the judgment of the General Grand Master, shall be necessary, whose duty shall be to examine all questions of Masonic law and jurisprudence, the status of membership, conflicts if opinion, appeals and grievances, as existing or arising within the bodies constituting the membership of the General grand Council, which may be referred to them for action or opinion, and such other duties as may be referred to them for action nor opinion, and such other duties as may be referred to them by the General Grand Master or presiding officer.

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- (c) **CREDENTIALS AND REGISTRATION.** A committee on CREDENTIALS AND REGISTRATION, to consist of five (5) or more members, whose duty it shall be to register all delegates at the Triennial Assembly, check all credentials and report as soon as practicable after the opening of the Triennial Assembly, the number of delegates present and entitled to vote and to participate in the proceedings thereof.

ARTICLE IV SPECIAL COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS. The General Grand Master may appoint such Special Committees as in his judgment would be to the best interest of this General Grand Council. The following committees are suggested: A committee on Publicity; A committee on Cryptic History and Promotion; A committee on Ritual and/or Work; A committee on Aims and Purposes; A committee on Charters and Dispensations; A committee on The Cryptic Room; A committee on Fraternal Dead; A committee on Topical Reference; A committee on York Rite Coordination; A committee on Visitors.

ARTICLE V INVESTMENTS AND FUNDS

SECTION 1. INVESTMENTS AND FUNDS.

- (a) **PERMANENT FUND.** There is hereby established a permanent fund, which shall consist of the bonds and cash on hand in a special account. As of September, 1984, this fund was \$50,000. The principal and any contribution to it shall be kept intact. This shall be considered the Permanent Fund and the earnings of this fund shall be transferred to the General Fund for the General expense of this General Grand Council.
- (b) **TRUSTEES.** The above fund shall be held in trust by the General Grand Treasurer. The General Grand Master, the Deputy General Grand Master and the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, shall be trustees of this fund. No funds shall be transferred from the Permanent Fund except by action of the General Grand Council, who may, in case of an emergency transfer to the General Fund such funds as may be deemed necessary for the well being of the General Grand Council.
- (c) **GENERAL FUND.** The General Fund shall consist of all moneys that are received by the General Grand Recorder and by him transmitted to the General Grand Treasurer and shall only be paid out by warrants drawn by the General Grand Recorder, and such warrants shall be countersigned by the General Grand Master. The General Fund shall be under the direction of the committee on Finance and Accounts of the General Grand Council, and they shall prepare a budget at each Triennial Assembly for the general expenses of the General Grand Council.

**ARTICLE VI
CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION**

SECTION 1. How AMENDED. This Constitution may be amended at any Stated Assembly by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present as specified in Article 1, Section 2.

- (a) **How PROPOSED.** All amendments to this Constitution of the General Grand Council, of Cryptic Masons must be proposed in writing.
- (b) **CONTENTS.** They must contain such section or sub-section thereof which it is proposed to amend, in its entire from, as it is intended to be after it is amended.
- (c) **ADDITIONAL SECTIONS.** If desirable, such proposed amendments may be numbered as additional sections of sub-sections thereof.
- (d) **FILED WITH THE GENERAL GRAND RECORDER.** Such proposed amendments shall be forwarded to the General Grand Recorder at least six (6) months prior to the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.
- (e) **GENERAL GRAND RECORDER DUTY.** The General Grand Recorder shall five (5) months prior to the date of the next Triennial Assembly of this General Grand Council, mail to each of he General Grand Officers, Past Grand Masters, Grand Recorders and Grand Masters of each Constituent Grand Council a copy of all proposed amendments which shall have been filed with him.
- (f) **JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE.** The Jurisprudence Committee shall carefully consider all such proposed amendments and report thereon to the General Grand Council at its next Triennial Assemble and no action shall be taken thereon by the General Grand Council until such report shall have been made.
- (g) **EFFECTIVE DATES.** Unless other-wise provided by the General Grand Council, all amendments presented shall take effect immediately after adoption.

SECTION 2. NON-MEMBER GRAND COUNCIL. Nothing contained in this Constitution shall be constructed to derogate from the right or authority of any Grand Council which may not determine to become a constituent member of this General Grand Council.

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SECTION 3. MEMBER GRAND COUNCIL. Any Grand Council may become a Member of this General Grand Council whenever it shall ratify and accept this Constitution. Upon such acceptance and ratification the Grand Recorder shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder.

SECTION 4. GRAND COUNCIL CONSTITUENCY. Every Grand Council shall be sovereign in its own jurisdiction, and may withdraw its constituency from this General Grand Council; Provided, always, that before such withdrawal shall be effective in the General Grand Council, a certified copy of the resolution of withdrawal so adopted by the constituent Grand Council shall be filed with the General Grand Recorder, which resolution shall be signed and certified by the Grand Master and Grand Recorder of the Grand Council so withdrawing; and provided further that if, at the time of the withdrawal of any Grand Council, any companion of the Grand Council so withdrawing, shall at the time of such withdrawal be an officer of or hold a membership on a committee of this General Grand Council., such office or committeemanship shall become vacant; and provided further, that all indebtedness to this General Grand Council shall have been paid.

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
